Fishing in Cyprus is a primary activity that touches all aspects of culture.

Is defined not only as the act of obtaining fish for consumption, but also as a way of understanding life, interacting with one another, and co-habiting with one's natural environment. Fishing settlements have maintained a certain social "fishing architecture".



Problems of Fishing Sector and Fisheries

- fish stocks are diminishing, Areas
- □ low income,

- aging fishermen,
- illegal fishing,
- Iow productivity and high production costs
- pressures on the marine environment (pollution/ loss of habitats)
- insufficient management, no protection and promotion of cultural resources and much more...

- Strengthening the cooperation and capacity of local actors to achieve sustainable development.

No direct measures for the promotion or protection of cultural heritage or new economic activities to promote fishing cultural!

Fishing Tourism in Cyprus: an alternative way to learn traditional fishing culture

The Larnaca-Famagusta FLAG brough together the fishermen of the fisheries-dependent village, Zygi, to create tourism-related activities carried out by the professional fishermen

Total Budget: 100.000€

Results

- ✓ 38 tours took in place
- \checkmark 170 people took part in the tours.
- \checkmark Increase 15% of income
- 6 young people (ages up to 35)
 were in involved in the fishing tourism activity




Exchange of Experience

Best Practise: Pesca Tourism ⇒ as an example to include in the Local Fisheries Strategy a new call for projects for Fishing Tourism.

- Definition of a fishing tourism legislation
- Definition of fishing tourism and services/business-marketing plan
- Education course for the fishermen for fishing tourism
- Call for the fishing tourism (budget of 300.000€) ⇒ 32 projects have been submitted
- ➤ Call for the education of fishermen ⇒ call open in October ⇒ 116 hours training programme

Is there a Solution?

- Is there a solution for intercepting the crisis in the fishing sector and communities and at the same time preserve fishing heritage?
- moving towards new economic activities => Tourism, new products/ services:
 - > Improve the Image of Fisheries,
 - > Creates economic potential to the local level,
 - > sustainability of fishing
 - > boost the survival of the sector without changing cultural habits, customs, and lifestyles.
 - > maintaining the fishing identity.

Presentation Focus



- Two projects the INTERREG EUROPE_CHERISH and HORIZON 2020_ PERICLES combine their forces in showcasing the heritage value that the fishing communities bear as well as the local knowledge they transfer generation to generation.
 - Common Interest: Analyzing the communallyled way that the fishermen associations operate.

٠

- Challenges in the region: limited fishermen populations, and low income from fishing activity, lagoon fishing tradition is becoming endangered
- Aim: Preservation and raising awareness on the traditional knowledge





THE LEGACY OF PERICLES

PERICLES work results in a number of actual products that are meant to exist after the duration of the program and to be freely used by interested parties in the local community. Some are designed in collaboration to CHERISH.

Data base of fishing cultural heritage in NE Aegean. This includes, archaeological data, archival material (texts and photographs), video and audio records. It is housed at the Visual Anthropology Lab, University of Crete and the Fisheries Research Institute, Kavala.

Visual and printed materials that showcase fishing cultural heritage. These include short thematic videos, "fish stories' leaflets, coffee table book (e.g. <u>https://www.pericles-heritage.eu/views-from-the-aegean-the-many-aspects-of-fishing-cultural-heritage/</u>). Collaboration with CHERISH in incorporating some of this materials in fish marketing and fishing cultural heritage promotion policies.

Educational web site, PERICLES Greece, hosted by F.R.I.(<u>https://pericles.inale.gr/</u>) that includes information on fishing cultural heritage. This will live on as part of F.R.I.'s outreach program, free for all.

The Portal. An interactive map that encourages citizen's participation in mapping local coastal cultural heritage. Collaboration with CHERISH in enriching local record and turning it into a regional asset.

Case study: Nestos lagoons

"Traditional Ecological knowledge and elements of tangible and intangible heritage of fishing communities in the Nestos Delta Lagoons Complex"

- **Geography**: Four lagoon-fishing areas are located on the Nestos river delta.
- The uniqueness of the Cooperative's modus operandi: are communally-led with all profits being shared equally between fishermen in contrary with the sea fishermen which compete each other for the catches. The Cooperative president decides on the fishing strategy of all the lagoons and how the fish will be sold to market, while each lagoon has its leader (Kapetanios) who organizes the necessary work to be done.
- **Challenges**: are not enough fishermen, do not earn enough from fishing to survive on fishing alone, lagoon fishing tradition is becoming endangered, young generation do not follow the fishing activity.
- **Constrains**: The Nestos delta has a Natura 2000 and Ramsar designation and it is included in the National Park of East Macedonia & Thrace.





Local community aspirations



- Train the young generation if possible
- Document the impact of pesticides from surrounding agricultural land on their traditional fishing practices.
- Try to find ways to have better prices for their catches (grey mullets, grey mullet egg rowbottarga, sea bream, blue crab), which don't have a good market and a lot of times are sold in very low prices.
- There is growing interest in incorporating tourism activities at the lagoon's fishing activity (birdwatchers scheduled trips to the lagoons & establishment of a small information center).

What is worth preserving



- Importance of the socio-economic conditions in the stability of the system and the risks faced by the fishermen and the lagoon habitat itself.
- The longevity of this method of fishing in lagoons,
- The rich network of traditional knowledge involved in the successful workings of this type of fishing.

Methodology and techniques

- A. Biliographic research
- B. Qualitative research through ethnographic field work with semi-structured interviews

Aims of the research

- a. Traditional Ecologic Knowledge of fishing communities in the Nestos Delta lagoon complex (CHERISH deliverable)
- b. Record elements of tangible and intangible cultural heritage of fishing communities





Case study: "Traditional Ecological knowledge and elements of tangible and intangible heritage of fishing communities in the Nestos Delta Lagoons Complex"



Research thematic areas

- Demographic profile of the fishermen
- Geography of the Nestos Delta Lagoon complex
- Natural environment of the Nestos Delta complex
- History, organization and management of the Lagoon fishing Cooperative (LFC)
- Fishing infrastructure and tools of the Nestos Delta Lagoon complex
- Fishing in the Nestos Delta Lagoon complex and art
- Intangible cultural heritage of the Nestos
 Delta Lagoon complex.





Field work



ΔΗΜΟΣ ΚΑΒΑΛΑΣ

Mutual field work:

1. The Pericles project partner- FRI focused their work in documenting some of the fishing practices of the lagoon systems & Established consolidated communication networks with the fishermen.

2. Kavala municipality

- Conducted further interviews with fishermen at Nestos lagoons
- Used interviews to raise profile of fishermen in the local area and in the city of Kavala.
- Planned activities to promote lagoon fish products
- Focused the research on the young members of the community (job creation, fishing tourism etc)





Achievements



 Raising awareness on the history and culture of the fishing community

- Efficient monitoring of tangible and intangible data
- Policy making influence through stakeholder meetings and bilateral ones
- Integrated action plan drafting on the cultural heritage of fishing communities
- Safeguarding funding for the young population through the Regional Operation Programme to start their own bussiness
