23-25 November 2021



A chat with Kai Schnackenberg?,

Scientific Officer, Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg, Ministry of Labour, Health, Social, Family Affairs and Integration

What is the status of the policies addressing smart healthy age-friendly environments in your region?

To address the challenges of demographic change and promote the development of (smart) healthy age-friendly environments, the City of Hamburg published the demographic concept "Hamburg 2030: More. Older. Diverse."

This document includes guiding principles and goals to strengthen the coexistence in neighborhoods facing a changing population. An important goal of the demographic concept is, for example, the creation of attractive and affordable housing for all generations and the development of new mixed housing and care models that enable people to keep living at home even in need for care. The concept includes initiatives that implement those principles and goals. Continuous updates take place to welcome new projects and policies, and consider more recent demographic dynamics in the different districts.

One particular initiative by the advisory board "Landes-Seniorenbeirat" (in short LSB) succeeded to create a new Hamburg law named "Seniorenmitwirkungsgesetz (HmbSenMitwG)" or "Senior's Participation Act". The initiative and law aim at strengthening participation rights of elderly citizens in Hamburg, incorporating their experiences and skills in policymaking, and improving relations between all generations. Thanks to this new norm, a committee will represents the interests of older generations (60+) and participants, supporting and advising the senate and authorities on projects and initiatives concerning the elderly. Furthermore, the initiative established LBS as an important regional stakeholder and a collective voice in the public debate.

Who are the key SHAFE's stakeholders in your territory and what is your strategy to engage with them?

Our stakeholders' group is quite diverse. It includes city authorities, such as the Ministry of Labour, Health, Social, Family Affairs and Integration, which I represent.

Ersatzkrankenkasse), the cluster agency GWHH Health economy Hamburg and the local association Hamburgische Arbeitsgemeinschaft für Gesundheitsförderung e.V. In addition, the group includes specialised local private companies OptiMedis, Gesundheit für Billstedt/Horn, Netzwerk gesund aktiv, Q8, QDS, Pflegen&Wohnen. Finally, we have participation from the local universities, i.e., HafenCity Universität Hamburg (HCU), Hochschule für Angewandte Wissenschaften Hamburg (HAW) and Universität Hamburg.

Thanks to their work in current and future initiatives in Hamburg within the field of healthy agwing and integrated health care, all of these group stakeholders have valuable expertise to support creating new thematic policies and resources for project development both locally and internationally. The EU_SHAFE project has enabled us to strengthen existing partnerships and create new collaborations, whilst building a common approach to to manage current challenges.

Which is the added value you think EU_SHAFE will bring to your region?


Locally, the project has created additional room for exchange amongst stakeholders in the field of smart and healthy living environments. This has allowed us to follow a participative approach in decision-making processes and identify opportunities for new (shared) projects or initiatives and better match technological innovations with users' real needs and expectations. For us, as a public authority, the project represents the perfect chance to go beyond our usual field of interest and boost new policy areas of intervention. I strongly believe that the project contributes to the achievement of the overarching political goal, which is to ensure a better quality of life and develop a more inclusive health and social care infrastructure for citizens of all ages.
