Digitization policies: 'Riberana'

MANRA has set up an innovative digitization department,
'Riberana', developed in the framework of the previous CD-ETA project.





Developed tools:

- Interactive virtual tours
- 360-degree videos
- 3D models

- Interactive maps
- **■** Photogrammetry techniques



Thanks to Riberana's platform, the MUMA and the Museu Faller of Alzira increased the number of virtual visits compared to the period before the pandemic.






