REPORT OF THE DISCUSSION

The event of 11 July regarding the International stakeholders event held from Lazio Region inside of the context of the Summer school for the circular economy 2022 originates to showcase the results of two EU funded projects: DIGIPRIME -Horizon 2020 and the Interreg Europe Project Replace
