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European Territorial Cooperation (ETC)


Interreg: 4 strands, almost 100 programmes, more than 8 billions euros ERDF

A	cross-border	73 programmes EUR 5,800 million (72%)	
В	transnational	14 programmes EUR 1,467 million (18%)	
С	interregional	4 programmes EUR 500 million (6%)	Interreg Europe Urbact, Interact, Espon
D	outermost regions	4 areas EUR 270 million (3%)



Programme's rationale

Interreg Europe rationale

Supports the identification and transfer of good practices among EU regions in order to improve regional development policies

Helps policy makers to find new solutions to their challenges

Primarily dedicated to public authorities



Focus on exchange of experience

Different from crossborder or transnational cooperation

Programme scope

Cooperation scope

1 cross cutting priority on capacity building —— 6 main 'topics'



















Concentration principle (80%)

Improving the Cohesion Policy

Focus on Structural Funds programmes

At least 1 policy instrument per project must be an Investment for Jobs and Growth programme

Learning by doing: Pilot actions

Innovative approaches

Pilot actions possible:

- From the start of the project
- At midterm

Two phases of project implementation

Implementation of activities

2 phases over 4-year implementation

CORE	FOLLOW UP
3 years	1 year
Exchange of experience to achieve policy improvements	Monitor policy improvements

Who should be involved?

Who is eligible?

- Public authorities
- Public law bodies
 (bodies governed by public law)
- Private non-profit bodies



Policy relevance of partnership

Policy responsible authorities must be involved in the project:

- As partners for at least 50% of the policy instruments addressed
- As 'associated policy authorities' for the remaining policy instruments

Creation of a **stakeholder group** in each region

- Four areas to be covered
- Mix of more and less advanced regions

North	Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway, Sweden
East	Austria, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia
South	Croatia, Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Malta, Portugal, Spain
West	Belgium, France, Ireland, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Switzerland





Project funding

Co-financing rates

Co-financing rates	According to legal status or location
80% ERDF*	Public or public equivalent from the EU
70% ERDF*	Private non-profit from the EU
50% Norwegian funding	Public, public equivalent and private non-profit from Norway (NO)
Swiss funding	Public, public equivalent and private non-profit from Switzerland (CH)

Simplified financial rules

Cost categories	
Preparation costs	Lump sum €17,500
Staff	Fixed % applied to salary cost
Office & administration	Flat rate of 15% of staff costs
Travel	Flat rate of 15% of staff costs
External Expertise and Services	
Equipment	
Infrastructure and Works	for pilots only

More simplification:

- Simplified reporting, faster payments to projects
- Less control (sampling, risk-based verifications)


