First call	
(5 April – 31 May 2022)	
134	project proposals
72	approved projects
54%	success rate
EUR 102 million	Interreg funds allocated

Second call	
(15 March - 9 June 2023)	
146	project proposals
78	approved projects
53%	success rate
EUR 112 million	Interreg funds allocated

More than 60% of projects' budget already allocated.

1. Project objectives & activities

Project **objective**

Remember the 3 key concepts:

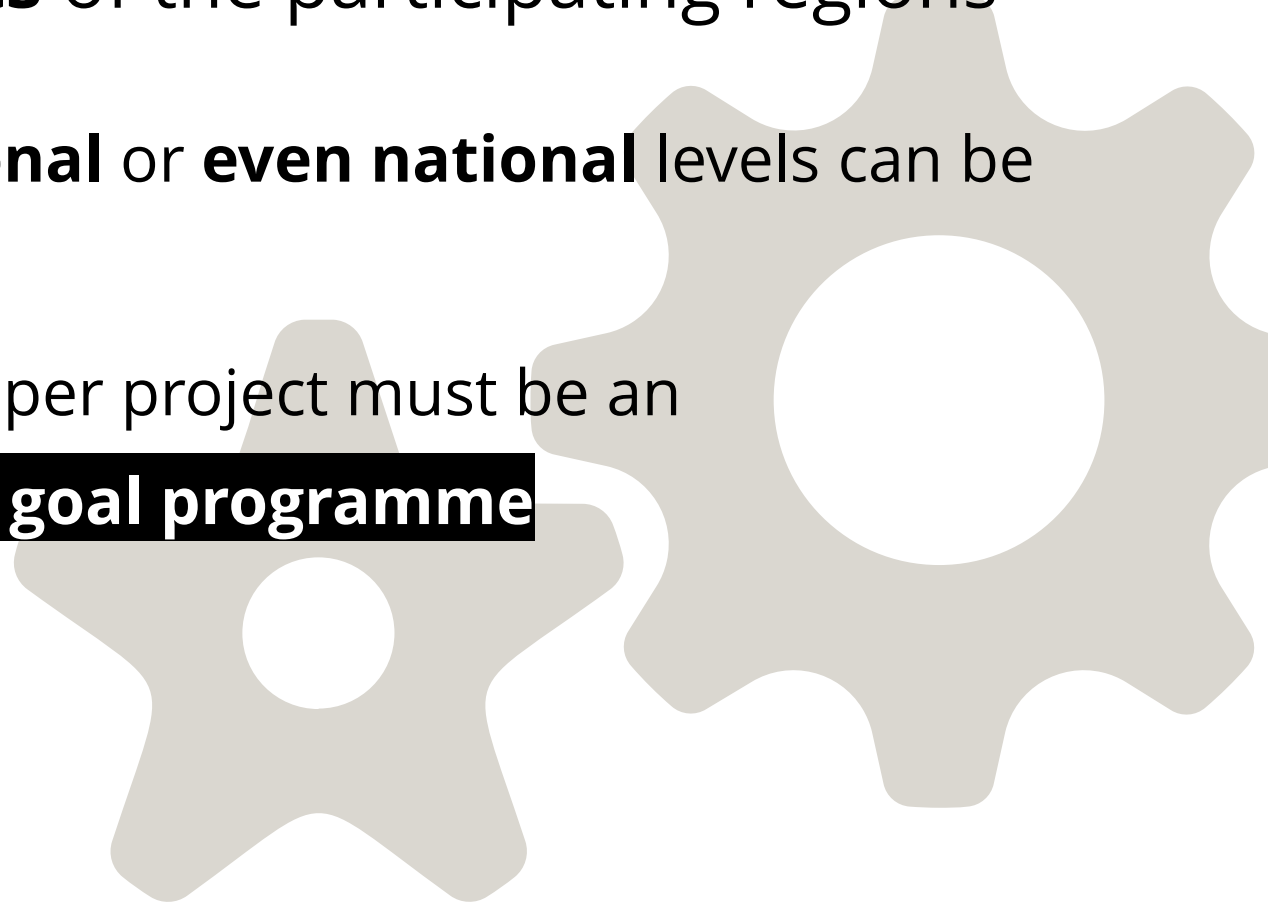
- **Policy instrument**
- **Policy responsible authority**
- **Policy improvement**



Project **objective**

Improve the **policy instruments** of the participating regions

- Public interventions at **local, regional** or **even national** levels can be addressed
- But at least **one** policy instrument per project must be an **Investment for jobs and growth goal programme**



Project **activities**

- Exchange of experience & **capacity building** through identification and transfer of **good practices**
- **Pilot actions** possible from the start of the project or at mid-term (but maximum one per policy instrument)

What is a **good practice**



- A **policy-related** initiative
- Proved to be **successful** in a region
- Potential **source of inspiration** for other regions

What is a **pilot action**



Implementation-related activities dedicated to **testing** a new public intervention approach.

Possible only under certain conditions:

- Clear contribution to policy improvements
- Clear interregional & testing character

Implementation of activities

2 phases over 4-year implementation

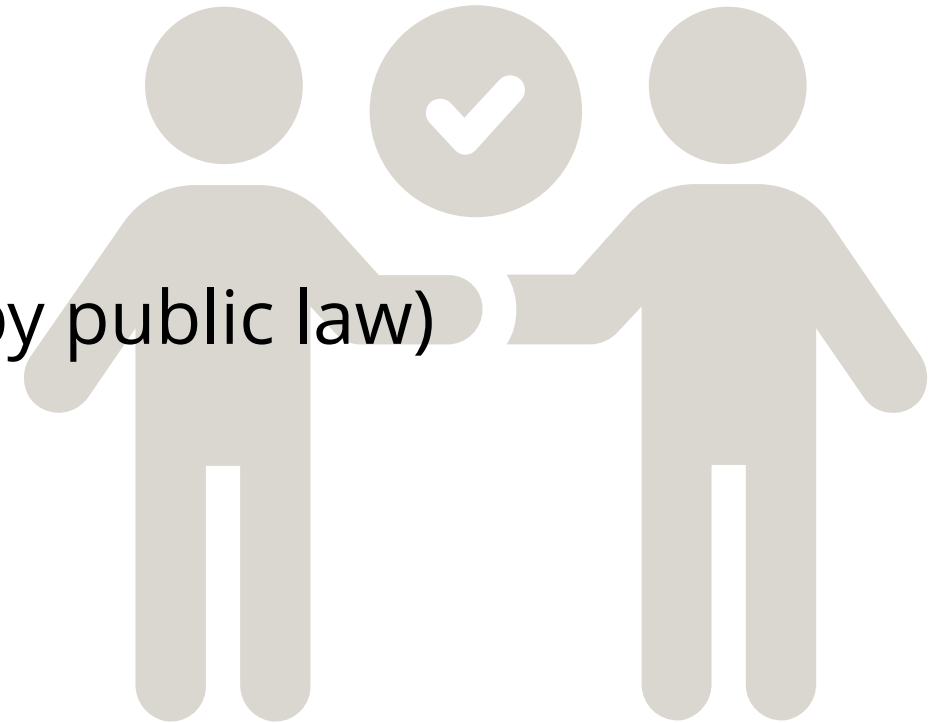

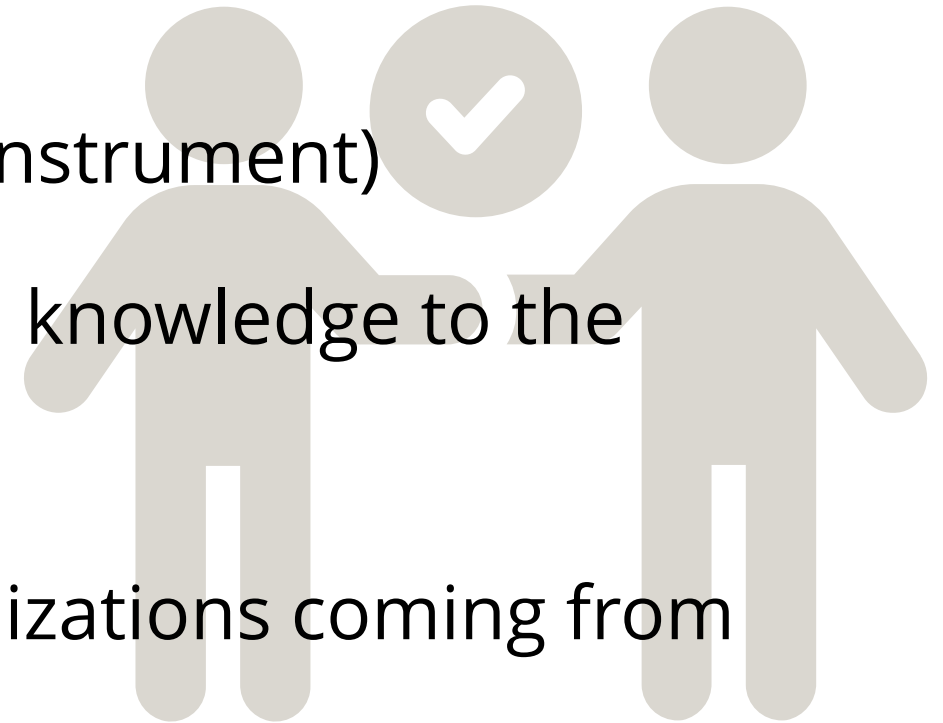
Who is **eligible**?

- **Public authorities**
- **Public law bodies** (bodies governed by public law)
- **Private non-profit bodies**



What type of **involvement**?

- **Project partner** (addressing a policy instrument)
- **Advisory partner** (bringing additional knowledge to the entire partnership)
- **Discovery partner** (reserved to organizations coming from the 7 candidate countries)



Discovery partner



Rationale: facilitate participation from the 7 new countries

Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, Ukraine

Main characteristics:

- Lighter form of involvement: no need to address a policy instrument
- Aim: to discover interregional cooperation and learn from others
- Recommendation: max 2 per project

Policy relevance of partnership

Policy responsible authorities must be involved in the project:

- As **partners** for at least **50%** of the policy instruments addressed
- As '**associated policy authorities**' for the remaining policy instruments

Creation of a **stakeholder group** in each region

What is an **'associated policy authority' (APA)**



Main features:

- Officially included in the application form
- No budget - travel & accommodation costs covered by relevant project partner
- Declaration provided at the application stage
- Involvement regularly monitored during project implementation

* APA is not a project partner but a 'golden stakeholder'

Geographical coverage

- **Broad** coverage required
- **Mix** between more and less advanced regions
- **4 out of 5 areas** must be covered by the partnership

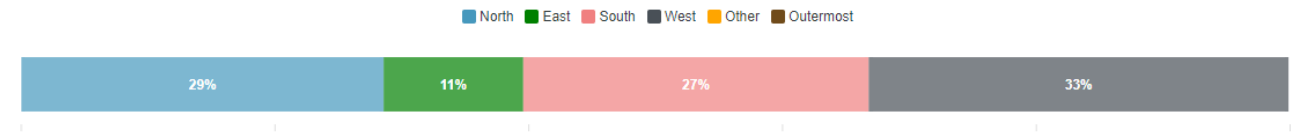

Ask for feedback from the joint secretariat

- Once the **call is open** and your project idea is clear
⇒ ask for **programme's feedback** (one feedback per idea and call)

Our officers can give you feedback:

- In writing
- On the phone/ online
- At events (check agendas carefully)

Time for questions



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First and second calls - **lessons learned**

On eligibility

- Ensure that at least one instrument is an **Investment for growth & jobs** goal programme
- Check carefully the **'policy responsible authority' status** of the organisations involved in the project
- Don't prepare documents (e.g., declarations) at the last minute

First and second call - **lessons learned**

On quality assessment

- **Partnership** is key
 - Broad geographical area (e.g., AL, BA, BG, ME, MK, SI and part of FR also in MED)
 - Balanced partnership (e.g., country representation, mix between more & less advanced regions)
 - Policy relevance of partners
- Quality of **results**
 - Innovative character (especially when partners come back on similar topic)
 - Expected policy improvements

Please justify when **programme recommendations** are not followed

Key to **successful application**

- Thorough **preparation**
 - Read carefully programme documents (e.g., the manual)
- **Assistance** tools
 - Use self-assessment tool
 - Ask for JS feedback (during open call)
 - Join assistance events
- Get to know our **selection process**
 1. Eligibility = ineligible proposals get **no further assessment**
 2. Quality criteria = meet programme expectations

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
