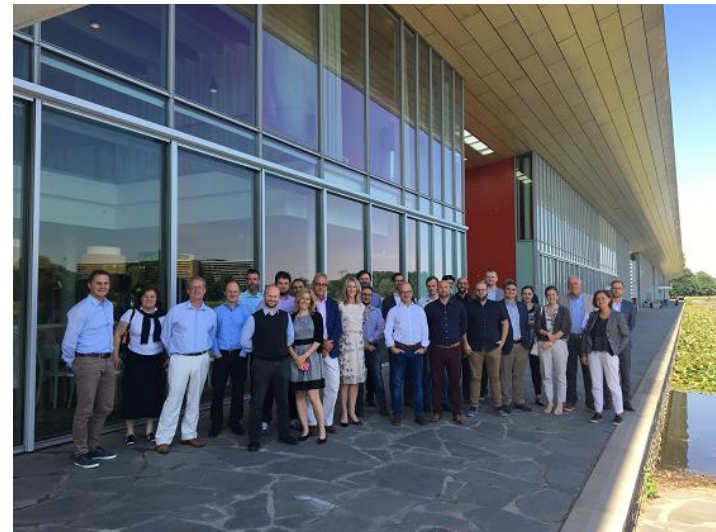

Project goal

Improve availability and use of Research and Innovation Infrastructure (RII) for SMEs

Partnership

8 European regions from Italy, the Netherlands, Belgium, Germany, Latvia, Estonia, Czech Republic and Sweden with common RIS3 smart specialization priorities



PROJECT APPROACH

01 UNDERSTANDING OF LOCAL CONDITIONS

Regional context profile

Overall characteristics of the regional innovation systems and Smart Specialization Strategies.

Serves as a knowledge base for further analysis and experience exchange among partners.

Mapping of RIIIs

Identification of the most relevant RIIIs in the partner regions, including their main needs and exploitation potential.

Creates an overview of the RIIIs in the regions and of the opportunities to improve policy instruments.
Allows knowledge sharing and mutual learning between partners, provides information for SMEs on available RIIIs.

Good practices

Identifying and sharing of good practices that demonstrate positive elements as well as challenges in the use of RIIIs.

Enables learning from experiences in other regions, to share and to re-use this knowledge and to develop local Action Plans to improve RII accessibility.

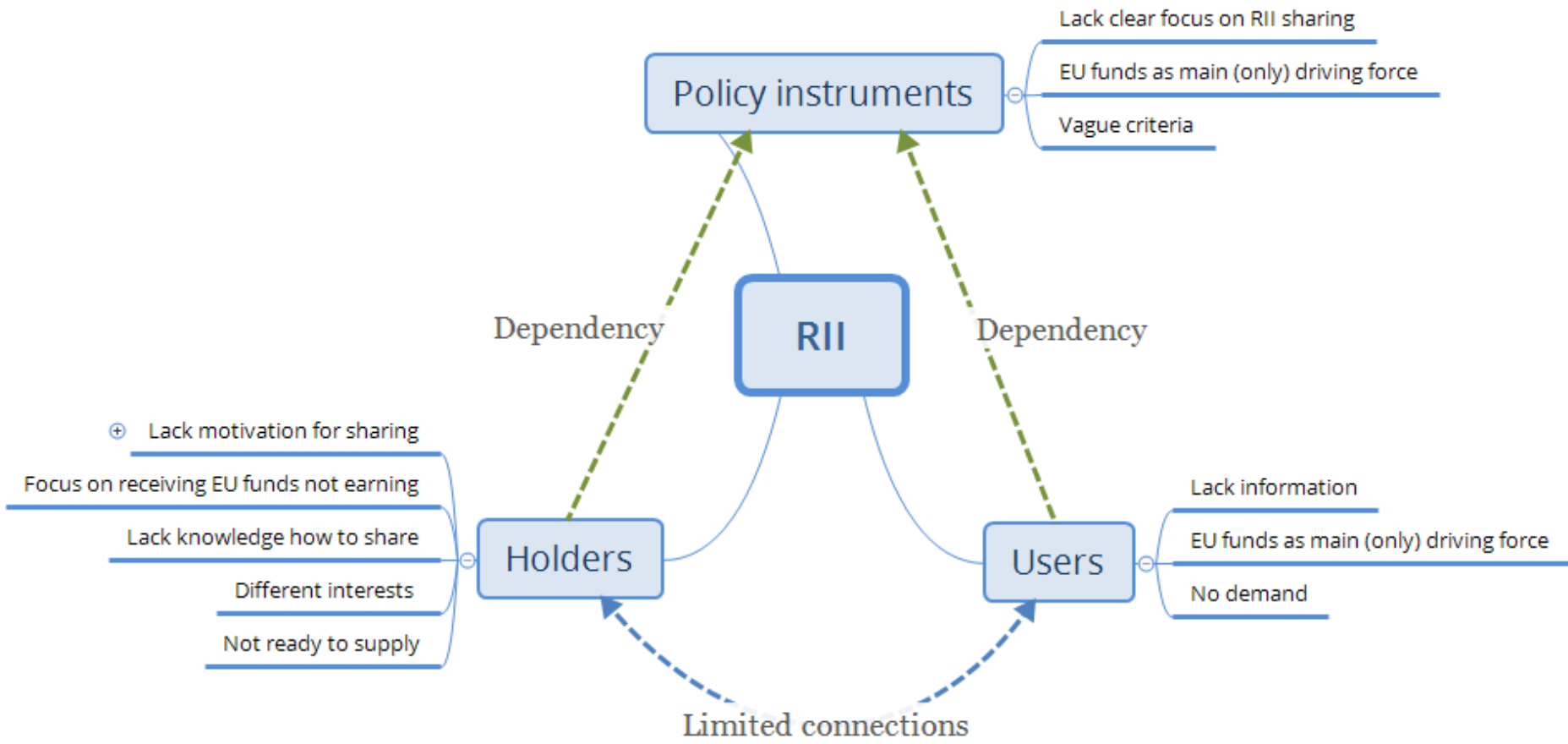
INVOLVEMENT OF LOCAL STAKEHOLDERS

- Study visits to 4 regions in The Netherlands, Belgium, Italy and Sweden to exchange knowledge and ideas between the partner-regions

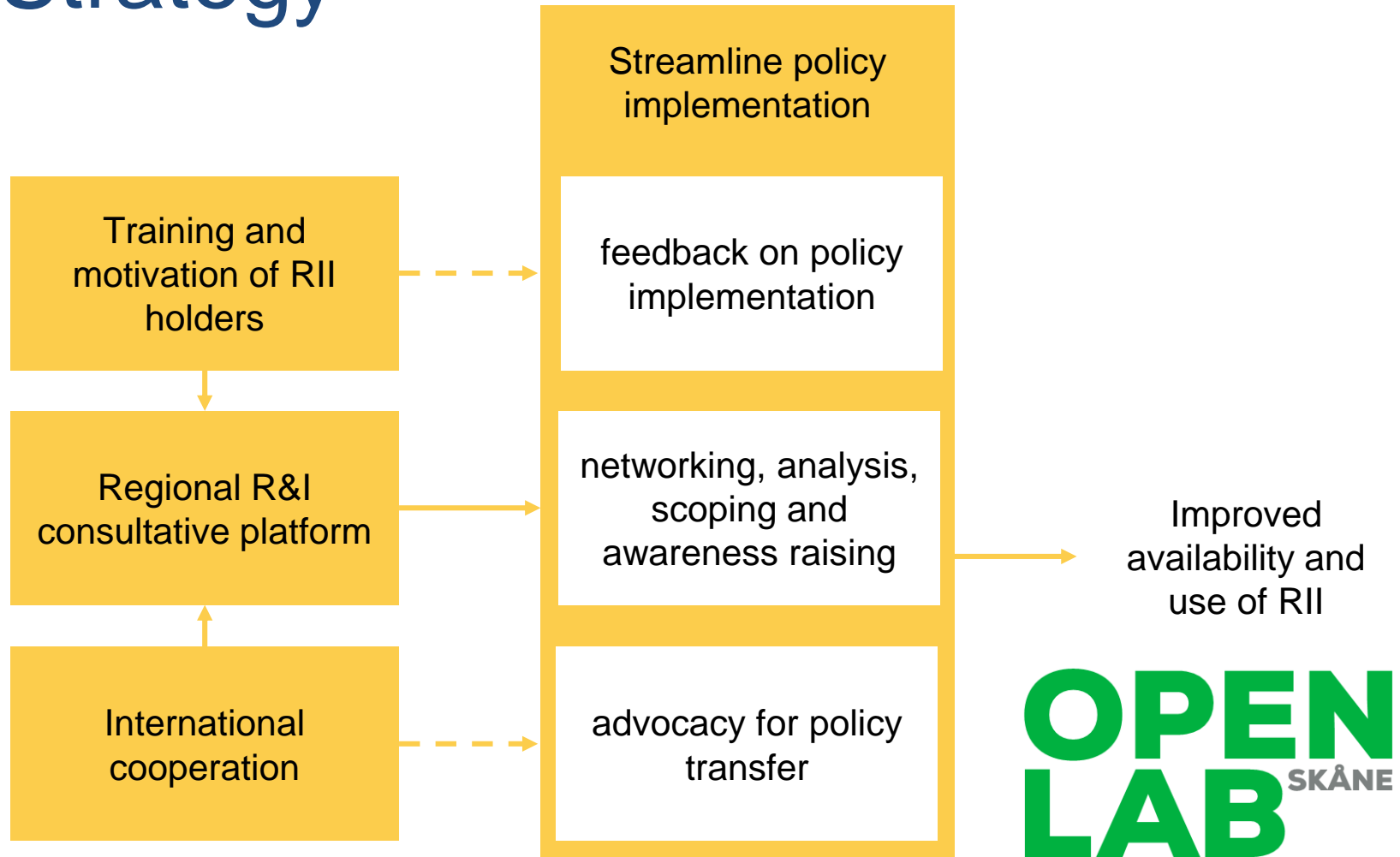
- Peer review meetings to learn from each other and explore possible collaboration opportunities.

Best practice transfer

OpenLab Skåne (Sweden)

EU funded project in Skåne Region jointly implemented by Malmö University, Lund University and the Smile Technology Business Incubator openlabskane.se

Allows universities and incubator to provide regional companies with access to their RII and to develop new products

Finances the work of coordinators, who work with companies, consult them, train their specialists for work with RII

Companies finance the cost of using the infrastructure and provide their specialists

Issues and challenges

Simple intervention (easy to grasp the idea)

Good potential of transferability

Quality of partnership with the top innovative region

Current policy instrument does not allow to finance such project

Policy makers are lacking practical solutions and examples

Change of mindset for RII holders and policy makers

Mid-term evaluations - window of opportunity
