The meeting was organised by Friuli Venezia Giulia Region with the support of the Central European Initiative, that is in charge of management and communication related activities of the project.</p> <p>Representatives of the main stakeholders' sectors attended the event (research, public authorities, new technologies, health and care, third sector-NGOs) providing a very well represented group that allowed a really fruitful and interesting debate. Three experts that had previously participated in the projects study visits, were also present: Mr. Pietro del Giudice, Mr. Alessandro Cavarape and Mr. Fabio Bonetta.</p> <p>The three representatives of FVG Region (Ms.Ketty Segatti-Director of the servizio istruzione, universita' e ricerca en Regione Autonoma Friuli Venezia Giulia; Gian</p>

				<p>Matteo Apuzzo, senior expert; and Ms. Elena Canciani, senior expert) welcomed all participants and presented the main outputs of the results obtained in the self-assessment tool questionnaire elaborated by Slovenia for ITHACA project.</p> <p>All participants actively contributed to the interesting debate by analyzing the main strengths and weaknesses of the regional smart health ecosystem and more specifically, the policy framework, the financial system, the system of information and dissemination of health services and innovation products, the involvement of stakeholders in innovation partnerships, the innovation cycle, and the main instruments of policy exchange.</p> <p>For FVG Region, 53 people participated in the questionnaire.</p> <p>After the presentation, there was some space to talk about the importance and great interest of participating to the study visits and EEPEs of the project.</p> <p>Some of the good practices and exchange of experience emerged during the study visits in Zealand (Holland) and Eindhoven (Denmark) in September and October respectively were highlighted.</p> <p>A further discussion about the opportunities and the difficulties of bringing these type of practices to FVG Region.</p> <p>To conclude, Ms. Ketty Segatti highlighted some key words to keep in mind as a conclusion of the Second Regional Stakeholders meeting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The need to work on technology at service to the individuals but not only (human/social dimension
