## Description

 CupCycle EST is a NGO who provides service to replace disposable cups with reusable and washable cups in public events and festivals









### How it works?

- Client will receive their beverage in a reusable cup and pays instantly the deposit of the cup (first time only).
- Used cups can be returned to designated locations in the event area followed by receiving a new cup or a return of the deposit money
- Smart NFC chip at the bottom of the cup enables automated returning and mobile payment on spot.





# **Financial framework**

CupCycle earns money by two main ways:

- service fee from event organisers or caterers 0.1 euros/used cup
- deposit money from nonreturned cups by users. Deposit money (2-3 euros) per cup is higher than the cost of the cup.

The main expenses are washing, logistics, storing of the cups and work labour expenses.







### **Results and learned lessons**

- Replacing disposable cups with reusable ones decreases the amount of resources needed for collecting and handling waste in public events:
  - In summer 2016 during the pilot project (24 000 visitors, 20 caterers) they prevented from throwing away at least 55 000 disposable cups.
- Festival organisers are motivated to pay the service fee as they cut the expenses of waste management.
- Environment-friendly appearance of an event is attractive to visitors.
- Local service provides smaller footprint for cup logistics and washing compared to international service. Starting from autumn 2017 cups have been produced in Estonia.
