HoCare project staff and internal experts (chief professional leaders and WP leaders) of the ongoing flagship projects of ÁEEK met on the 4th December 2017.

Ongoing flagship projects of ÁEEK are co-financed by ESIF through Human Resources Development Operational Programme (2014-2020). Many of these projects deliver new methods, solutions and advanced infrastructure in various branches of health and care sector, such as surgical day care services, psychiatric care network, child care, etc. Other projects would have a general impact on the sector by changing existing and creating new needs of formal and informal care providers. Development of SKILL LABs at hospitals shall improve not only skills and competences of medical staff, but quality of care and patient safety. Further improvement of the Hungarian National Electronic Health Cooperation Service Space (EESZT) will add new functions to the existing system (e.g. m-Health, remote care, tele-pathology etc.)

During the internal meeting:

I. Internal experts were informed about:

- 1. The work resulting 3 Thematic Studies and 3 Policy Transfer Reports**, including brief information about the **country specific conclusions and recommendations** of these documents.
- 2. KEY CHALLENGES** detected by the studies and reports concerning following topics:

Innovation in home care to satisfy unmet needs:

- innovation ecosystem - formal and informal healthcare providers inside of the innovation ecosystem and the transfer of knowledge of unmet needs;
- support from operational programme - support of formal and informal healthcare providers inside the research and innovation projects in the operational programme.

Public driven innovation in home care:

- innovation ecosystem – public organizations as ppi, pcp and other innovative projects initiators,
- support from operational programme - support of public driven innovation programmes / initiatives from operational programme.

Bringing results of innovation faster to home care market:

- innovation ecosystem – quadruple helix cooperation to boost homecare solutions faster to the market;
- support from operational programme - support of market successful innovation developed by quadruple helix cooperation inside the research and innovation projects in the operational programme.

participants discussed the **good practices** provided by HoCare project partners and agreed to concentrate on examining the possibilities and opportunities of transferring the following GPs:

- a) GPs about the driving function of end-users' unmet needs, which may be interesting to transfer:
 - the **way of** cooperation (*learnings and elements of the following 2 GPs might be transferred jointly in one lot*):
 - InTraMed-C2C (CZ)
 - GRACE (PT);
 - the **result of** cooperation (*learnings and elements of the following 2 GPs might be transferred jointly in one lot*):
 - Tele-Rehabilitation (CY)
 - RehabNet (PT).
- b) GPs about public driven innovation, which may be interesting to transfer:
 - the **way of** cooperation (*learnings and elements of the following 2 GPs might be transferred jointly in one lot*):
 - Codification of projects' evaluation targeting societal challenges including Health, Demographic changes and Well-being (PT)
 - Evaluation bonus for addressing horizontal priority "Health for all" (LIT)
 - the **result of** cooperation (*learnings and elements of the following 2 GPs might be transferred jointly in one lot*):
 - Tele-hippocrates (CY)
 - Check Point Cardio (BG)
- c) GPs about putting innovation faster to market, which may be interesting to transfer:
 - the **way of** cooperation:
 - EkoSMART (SLO)
 - the **result of** cooperation:
 - Psiprof (PT)
