Maker Lab Slovenia – an experimental/research fabrication laboratory based at the University of Ljubljana	The partnership projects that have been developed through the Maker Lab, connecting rural business and stakeholders with masters, doctoral and post-dec students are an inspiring model of collaboration and good governance in an innovation systems, sharing and enabling access to both human and technical resources. This approach has been influential in our future service development where e-governance, will be at the forefront
Lab <u>Altobello</u>	Lab Altabello with it's multiple 'family friendly' services, (linking social innovation with digital innovation) co-developed with uses (co-working space, with linked crêche for example) again is a governance model which serves for our future service development. The continuous or permanent innovation process was particularly noted where management and users jointly evolve services to meet user and community needs. Our e-governance plans for current and future service development again will incorporate lessons learnt from Lab Altabello
Nerve Centre and Eighty One and Co-Lab, Derry and Donegal	The collective evolution of the culture, co-working and digital start up hubs visited in Ireland through multi-stakeholder governance of the hubs, the focused development of 'cooperation environments'has contributed and will contribute to our e-governance models for future service development in our region
Lormes Digital Hub	The multi-functional hub visited in Lormes, in a remote rural upland areas, where public, community and business services are found in the same location and where staff serve different functions for all three 'user' groups again is an 'e-governance' model both for multi-service delivery in a local hub or service eco-system, where the lines between public, private and community goods or actors need to be more porous.
