Source of evidence




INTERREG IVC (2007-2014)

- Waste prevention and management






HOW TO COLLECT EVIDENCE

Survey focus



1. policy change(s) in the region

- 80% indicated a change took place
 - 1. new project or initiative 71%
 - 2. improved management
 - 3. change in the strategic focus of a policy




2. the effects of the policy change(s) in the regions

- 142 reported a long-term effect
- From 21 different countries
- Diverse effects:
 - 1. support to SME internationalisation (project DIFASS)
 - 2. investments in a wind turbine (project RENERGY)
 - 3. setup of public transport agency (project EPTA)

Low carbon economy

Mobility in rural areas: MOG, Hungary

Project partner: Central Transdanubian Regional Innovation Agency

Inspiration:

Germany

KombiBUS, a mobility scheme with social services

Effect:

- 30 villages in Transdanubia adopted the scheme
- two thirds of the fleet switched to electric vehicles
- scheme turned nation-wide

Cherry heritage: VITOUR LANDSCAPE, Germany

Project partner: World Heritage Upper Middle Rhine Valley Association

a brand for local cherry products and visibility effect map

Italy

cultural heritage protection work-camps

Effect:

- New Mittelrheinkirschen brand and 300 trees planted
- 2-week summer work-camp in landscape preservation
- visual study for construction licencing for wind turbines near the valley
