## Food Works Programme

#### **Description**


- Food Works is a government supported accelerator programme for high potential, ambitious <u>food and drink</u> start-ups.
- Starting in 2012, the programme is a collaborative initiative run by three state agencies with the aim to support the rapid scaling and growth of innovative Irish food and drink start-ups
- Companies/start-ups must be less than 4 years old

#### **Funding and Resources**

- Started in 2012 ongoing
- Funded by 3 agencies
- Participation fee €3,000
- Participating businesses are eligible for feasibility grant funding of up to €35,000. This includes €15,000 for salary expenditure and up to €20,000

## Food Academy Programme

#### **Description**

- Food Academy was developed by Bord Bia, SuperValu and the Local Enterprise Offices in 2013 to provide a standardized programme of supports tailored to new and early-stage food businesses throughout the country.
- Through workshops, mentoring and the opportunity to pitch to SuperValu store owners this is a unique opportunity for artisan producers to have their product on the shelf of one of Ireland's leading retailers

#### Resources

- Finance and staff resources from the Local Enterprise Office, Bord Bia and SuperValu.
- The cost of running the programme which includes mentoring and workshops is funded by the Local Enterprise Offices.
