Field of Study	Definition	Equilibrium Points	School of Thought
Engineering	speed of return to equilibrium	Only one equilibrium point	Neoclassical
Ecological science	ability to absorb shocks before altering its structure	Several equilibrium points	Keynesian
Psychological sciences and organisational theory	ability to adapt in anticipation of, or response to, shocks	Equilibrium points change over time	Evolutionary Economics

General Government Expenditure (Euro Million)




Creative Destruction

National Recovery and Resilience Plan

- Part of the European Union's NextGenerationEU
- Ireland is due to receive €915 million between 2021 and 2022

Priority 3: Social and Economic Recovery and Job Creation

Project "ACT" Activating County Towns

- Cork County Council committed a fund worth €6 million to support community, festival, events and town enhancement works in 23 towns around County Cork.
- Some of the immediate actions being taken include;
 - I. A deep clean of the main retail and pedestrian areas
 - II. Decluttering and fixing street furniture
 - III. Replanting of trees and flowerbeds
 - IV. Additional road/pavement markings
 - V. Installation of 1,400 temporary bollards

What Next?

• Many non-viable businesses were kept afloat by business supports

• The removal of which could threaten otherwise viable businesses
