- Know your audience





The Ladder of Citizen Participation



Rights and the Responsibilities



Inform and consult are important steps in participatory processes, but they are not limited to it.

Authorities should **allow** and **foster** that participation occur and at different 'levels'

Having a **clear view** of the **stakeholder map**, it is possible to understand who and when to engage

Everyone who decides to engage in participatory processes, both from the government and citizens side, should understand the **limits** and **reach** of the processes





Citizen science for sustainable urban mobility: Empowering citizen traffic counters to shape local policy

Co-create and use innovative low cost, automated, road traffic counting sensors (i.e. Telraam) and multi-stakeholder engagement mechanisms in 5 pilots in Madrid, Ljubljana, Dublin, Cardiff and Leuven.






MORE approach enables stakeholders (e.g. municipal experts, residents, business owners) to collaborate in the design process, via co-creation 'Design Day' workshops.

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

Dresden's SUMP with broad citizen participation in the „Dresden Debate“
