# Interreg Europe core features

### **European Territorial Cooperation (ETC)**

Interreg: 4 strands, almost 100 programmes, more than 8 billions euros ERDF

<b>A</b>	cross-border	<b>73</b> programmes EUR 5,800 million (72%)	
В	transnational	<b>14</b> programmes EUR 1,467 million (18%)	
С	interregional	4 programmes EUR 500 million (6%)	Interreg Europe Urbact, Interact, Espon
D	outermost regions	4 areas EUR 270 million (3%)

## Interreg Europe objective

To improve "regional" development policies (including Investment for jobs and growth goal programmes)

#### How?

Through exchange of experience, innovative approaches and **capacity building** (in relation to the **identification & transfer of good practices**)

- Primarily dedicated to policymakers
- Focus on exchange of experience

Different from crossborder and transnational cooperation

### Programme scope

1 cross-cutting priority on capacity building (ISO1) six topics



















**Concentration** principle (80%)

### Two actions



#### Projects ('eMopoli' video)

Limited number of regions exchanging and transferring practices on a shared regional development issue

Partnership requirements:

- policy makers involvement
- broad coverage mixing less with well advanced regions

Further exploiting projects' achievements and opening up the programme benefits to all

### **Projects** main features

### Evolution towards more flexibility

- 'Lighter' focus on Structural Funds programmes
   (only 1 policy instrument per project must be a SF programmes)
- More flexibility in the phases1 core phase & 1 follow-up phase
- Action plans depending on core phase results
- Pilot actions possible from the start






## Peer learning in practice
