



The European Regional Development Fund

Policy objective 1 – Specific objectives

- SO 1.1. Developing and enhancing research and innovation capacities and the uptake of advanced technologies
- SO 1.2. Reaping the benefits of digitisation for citizens, companies, research organisations and public authorities
- SO 1.3. Enhancing sustainable growth and competitiveness of SMEs and job creation in SMEs, incl. by productive investments
- SO 1.4. Developing skills for smart specialisation, industrial transition and entrepreneurship
- SO 1.5. Enhancing digital connectivity

Investments should focus on the smart specialisation priority areas identified and developed in the process of entrepreneurial discovery. This is a regulatory requirement for investments under SO 1.1. and SO 1.4, strong recommendation for SO 1.2. and SO 1.3.

Focus of the ERDF – main highlights under policy objective 1

- Support for research and innovation activities that contribute to a smarter Europe by promoting **innovative and smart economic transformation**;
- **Place-based approach**: EDP needed to understand the needs of the territories and build on their competitive advantage;
- **Market orientation** of research and innovation activities: absorption of knowledge and its translation into new products, services and processes;
- **Digitalisation** as an innovation enabler;
- **Skills** related to the deployment of new technologies & processes (S3 related);
- **Innovation ecosystems**: links among research and innovation actors and industrial stakeholders.


Thematic Smart Specialisation Platforms

Starting in **2015**, the European Commission services launched three **thematic smart specialisation (S3)** platforms:

- **TSSP Agri-Food**
- **TSSP Energy**
- **TSSP Industrial Modernisation**
- **2022: A new platform focusing on Sustainable Blue Economy**

S3 Thematic Platforms:


- joint initiatives supported by the European Commission;
- wide range of advice and support services;
- Currently, 37 S3 partnerships active under existing TSSPs



There are 208 registered regions total, coming from 19 Member States and 7 non-EU countries


S3 Community of Practice – What?

- A comprehensive and integrated **technical assistance** for **platforms** and **S3 community**;
- The **main point of contact and source of information** on the S3 concept;
- **Advice on the development** and/or **implementation of smart specialisation** to national and/or regional authorities and stakeholders;
- **Analytical, advisory and technical support, project and expert databases, and communication activities**;





S3 Community of Practice – How?

- **S3 Community of Practice Secretariat**
- **S3 Community of Practice Website**
- **S3 Expert Database and Support**
- **S3 Conference**
 - a forum to inform the S3 stakeholders about the latest policy developments and Commission initiatives in relation to the S3
- **S3 Forum**
 - an opportunity for stakeholders to network, discuss S3 policy and implementation issues and exchange information and good practices
- **Three S3 Working Groups:**
 - dedicated to the criteria of the S3 enabling condition on **innovation diffusion, industrial transition and interregional cooperation**
- **S3 Expert Group:**
 - consisting of **leading S3 and innovation policy experts and academics** to discuss and advance the S3 concept



Interregional Innovation Investments (I3) Instrument

- Complementing **Horizon Europe** and other mainstream (ERDF) programmes;
- **INTERREG link** (Art. 13 ERDF Regulation): « 13.7. When implementing this instrument, the Commission shall ensure coordination (..) in particular with strand 'Interreg C (...)»
- With the focus on projects that are **close to market deployment**;
- Tailored for the **Cohesion** specific context.




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
I3 Instrument – Key features

- **Type of Investment:** Interregional Innovation Investments in companies (TRL 6-9) to accelerate the market uptake/commercialisation in S3 priority areas;
- **Final beneficiaries:** Companies, in particular SMEs;
 - **Expected outcome:** The financial and advisory assistance provided under Strands 1 and 2a is expected to lead toward mature joint innovation investment projects in companies.
- **Type of expenditure:** Productive investments / demonstration / piloting in companies;
- **Implementation:** Investment portfolio of interregional innovation investments through redistribution of the grant to final beneficiaries (eg. through cascade funding).





Capacity building Call – Q4/2022

- **Strand 2b** - Increasing the capacities of less developed regions to implement the interregional dimension
- Experiment **new approaches** and deliver **validated solutions, good practise examples**
- Indicative **core activities**:
 - Ecosystem Building and Connection;
 - Supporting the identification of investments projects;
- Indicative **support activities**:
 - Benchmarking the performance of local innovation actors against those in other regions;
 - Networking and staff exchange schemes.

Interreg Europe **rational**ale

Supports the identification and transfer of good practices among EU regions in order to **improve regional development policies**

Helps policy makers to find new solutions to their challenges

- Primarily dedicated to **public authorities**
- Focus on **exchange of experience**



Different from cross-border or transnational cooperation

Two actions



Projects

Limited number of regions exchanging and transferring experience on a shared regional development issue

Further exploiting projects' achievements and opening up the programme benefits to all


Projects' main features



- **Objective:** Improve the **policy instruments** of the participating regions
- **Activities:** exchange of experience & **capacity building** through identification and transfer of good practices
- **Duration:** 2 phases in **4-year** implementation

Who is **eligible**?

- **Public authorities**
- **Public law bodies**
(bodies governed by public law)
- **Private non-profit bodies**



Policy relevance of partnership

Policy responsible authorities must be involved in the project:

- As **partners** for at least **50%** of the policy instruments addressed
- As '**associated policy authorities**' for the remaining policy instruments

Creation of a **stakeholder group** in each region



Geographical **coverage**

- **Four areas** to be covered
- Mix of more and less advanced regions

Geographical areas	Countries covered
North	Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway, Sweden
East	Austria, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia
South	Croatia, Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Malta, Portugal, Spain
West	Belgium, France, Ireland, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Switzerland




First call **key figures**

Closed on 31 May 2022

134	project proposals
1,073	partners coming from all partner states
EUR 1.4 million	average budget per project proposal
EUR 192 million	total ERDF budget requested



First call - **first lessons learned**

- Ensure that partnership goes **beyond transnational** cooperation areas (e.g., MED covers Slovenia, Bulgaria and part of France)
- Check carefully the **'policy responsible authority' status** of the organisation involved in the project
- Select carefully the **policy instrument addressed** in each region
- Ensure that at least **one** instrument is an **Investment for growth & jobs goal programme**



Key to **successful project preparation**

- Thorough **preparation**
 - Read programme documents carefully (e.g. the manual)
- **Assistance** tools
 - Use self-assessment tool
 - Ask for JS feedback (during open call)
 - Join assistance events
- Get to know our **selection process**
 1. Eligibility = ineligible proposals get **no further assessment**
 2. Quality criteria = meet programme expectations
