

The case of the Ruhr Metropolis

- Part (sub-region) of the Federal State of North Rhine-Westphalia
- Approximately 5,1 million inhabitants
- One of Europe's biggest metropolitan areas
- Formerly one of Europe's biggest industrial locations
- Since 1960s: structural transformation from coal mining and steel production to new high-tech clusters (i.a., Greentech, IT, logistics)
- S3 means a paradigm shift for the Ruhr Metropolis: from funding a structurally weak region to funding based on strengths

RUHR METROPOLIS

ALSO KNOWN AS THE RUHR AREA

- Implicitly considered in North Rhine-Westphalia's smart specialisation strategy (very broad, no subregional focus)
- Developing S3 for the Ruhr Metropolis is a voluntary task, out of conviction
- A real bottom-up strategy
- A sub-regional strategy
 - For Ruhr Metropolis as a part of a bigger region
 - Explicitly built around the economic strengths of the municipalities
- Interreg Europe project "COHES3ION - Integrating the territorial dimension for cohesive S3" an important factor



- The Ruhr Metropolis itself is a big, polycentric and heterogeneous region
- 15 municipalities (11 cities and 4 independent districts) are the key stakeholders
- Relatively complex governance process
- How to balance political bargaining (interests) on the one hand and scientific evidence (facts and figures) on the other hand?
- At the same time, corresponding to the overarching regional S3

S3 FOR THE RUHR METROPOLIS

MULTI-LEVEL GOVERNANCE



- From local to regional clusters
 - Corresponding to the "natural" geographical extension
 - Increasing expectations regarding the level of smart specialisation with excellence becoming a standard
- Innovation projects across the borders of municipalities and their local clusters
 - Opening up to new topics and actors
 - Achieving bigger projects
- Distribution of tasks between the municipalities
 - Recognising the others' strengths
 - Recognising complementarities
