






Synergies between Cohesion Policy and Horizon Europe

Introduction

- The European Commission acknowledges the importance of the concentration of resources with the encouragement of exploiting complementarities and synergies between the ERDF, Horizon Europe, and other funds in order to achieve a critical mass of funding in priority areas
- The European Commission recommends regions to build synergies between the two most important EU R&I funding instruments—Horizon Europe and the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF).
- Synergies involve two or more programmes interacting to produce a greater effect than individual interventions.



Sequential funding downstreamed:

using ERDF to fund actions that capitalise on already implemented Horizon Europe projects

Alternative funding (Seal of Excellence):

providing ERDF to
project proposals which had
received a Seal of Excellence
Good practice: Innovation
voucher for Seal of
Excellence projects
(SMARTPILOTS)

Complementary funding:

bringing together funding from Horizon Europe and ERDF in the same project
