OBJECTIVES TACKLE AND BENEFIT GAINED DURING THE EVENT

Policy-Level Benefits:

Implementation of ShareRES takes place simultaneously with the enactment phase of the new regional development policy instrument, the Riga Region Development Programme 2021-2027. This allows for a good opportunity to integrate the project's achievements into a regional policy framework through practical experience.

From the point of view of subordination, the new Riga Region Development Programme necessitates that all local municipalities that are located in the territory of the region respect the regional development priorities. This includes both the priority actions and specific projects in municipal development policy instruments (local development documents).

Given that the regulatory framework and support schemes for energy communities and self-production are functions executed by the national authorities, a two-level strategic cooperation is being developed in Riga. The first type of cooperation concerns participation in the national regulatory process to support energy communities. The second cooperation envisages the transfer of project knowledge to regional and local-level development planning documents.

To capitalize on it, the ShareRES Riga team has approached all local municipalities and invited them to participate in the project stakeholder group to mutually coordinate activities with the aim of promoting practical projects in the field of community energy.

Project-Level Benefits:

1. Knowledge Sharing: ShareRES activities should leverage insights from previous energy community projects in Latvia. Collaboration with initiatives like StartSUN (Interreg) and EU technical assistance can help identify legal framework challenges, including the need for a dedicated billing system for energy communities.

2. Legal Framework Clarity: The Ministry of Climate and Energy's presentation of a draft regulation and discussions on technical and economic aspects provide a better understanding of Latvia's energy community legal framework. This sets the stage for upcoming public hearings, where expert input will enhance the final proposal and shape community projects.

3. **Expanded Collaboration**: The meeting has revitalized and expanded the network of energy community advocates across public, private, and civic sectors. The aim is to support knowledge exchange, informed discussions, and public involvement in policy-making, fostering innovative and cost-effective energy community projects in various municipalities within the Riga Planning Region.

THEMES AND EVENT CONTENT (Brief description)

On September 4th, we conducted the first Local Stakeholder Group (LSG) meeting as part of the ShareRES project in Alba Iulia. The meeting brought together various experts, including those from the municipal technical department, the buildings monitoring office, and individuals experienced in EU projects. Additionally, the Director of the Alba Local Energy Agency graced the occasion.

During this initial LSG meeting, the primary agenda included an introduction to the ShareRES project, its objectives, and planned activities. Subsequently, there were extensive discussions on the energy community and prosumer-related legislation within both Romania and the European Union. Furthermore, we delved into financial investments focused on enhancing energy efficiency.

THEMES AND CONTENT related to the project topic.

The meeting explored the chosen policy instrument, SECAP 2030, used in Alba Iulia, and how the ShareRES project could potentially influence its modification to align with project goals. Another point of focus involved dialogues with the LSG members regarding energy efficiency, especially given the ongoing municipal project financed through the Operational Program Large Infrastructure, which aims to construct a photovoltaic park contributing to the energy security of public buildings in the municipality. One significant outcome of this meeting was the realization that legislation in this domain is still evolving. There exists no widespread consensus in Romania regarding the precise definition and attributes of an energy community. We hold hope that, as the ShareRES project unfolds, there will be substantial legislative changes favoring the development of energy communities in Romania, drawing inspiration from successful models in countries like Spain, France, and Germany.

OBJECTIVES TACKLE AND BENEFIT GAINED DURING THE EVENT

- Collecting expertise from local specialists to identify local examples that can be disseminated on interregional scale.

- Disseminating the acquired knowledge at the interregional level back to the local level.

- Advocating for policy makers to improve the targeted policy instrument using shared information at this meeting.

THEMES AND CONTENT related to the project topic.

The meeting delved into the prospective impact of the ShareRES project on the designated policy instrument. A substantive discussion unfolded regarding the outcomes of the Peer Review: Fast-tracking of Renewable Energy Communities in the Cypriot Context, conducted in May 2023. This review primarily outlined the present state in Cyprus, emphasizing the absence of a pertinent Regulatory Framework, and outlined actionable steps required to progress in this domain.

Furthermore, ANEL showcased commendable practices shared during the International Events of ShareRES with stakeholders. The discussion centered on the feasibility of adopting and learning from these practices, enriching the overall dialogue on the subject.
