



Peer review: Framing the Urban Logistics Strategy



City of Warsaw, Poland

Peers from: Portugal, Greece, Netherlands, Spain, Lithuania

Recommendations:

- Formulate clear and ambitious city goal possible to quantify
- Create a core team responsible for the success of implementing the SULP
- Develop a collaborative business model
- Show a good practices and approach by public projects
- Implement a system of incentives and disincentives for business

Peer review: Implementing low emission zones



Romanian Ministry of Development, Public Works and Administration

Peers from: Bulgaria, Germany, Italy, Poland

Recommendations:

- Low emission zones should be integrated into SUMPs
- Have a dynamic approach to vehicle restrictions (to become stricter over time),
 focus on removing diesel vehicle
- Multi-level approach to communication national one-stop-shop + local information
