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Context

In Ireland, recent data highlights the underrepresentation of women in leadership within enterprises:

- As of 2023, women occupy 30% of senior executive roles and 19% of CEO positions across Irish businesses. Female representation is higher in certain sectors, such as service-related fields, with 43.5% of senior executives in "Other Service Activities" and 36.8% in accommodation and food services being women. However, male-dominated sectors like construction see only 13.4% female representation in senior roles.
- Female-led businesses comprise 25% of board members across companies in Ireland, with nearly one-fifth of board chairs being women. Representation has increased incrementally in both Irish- and foreign-owned enterprises since 2021.
 - These statistics reflect Ireland's ongoing efforts to close gender gaps, particularly in top corporate roles, but they also underscore the need for enhanced support for women in enterprise leadership and executive development programs.

Sample Irish Interventions

- 1. Increased Funding and Grants: Programs such as Enterprise Ireland's Competitive Start Fund (CSF) and Local Enterprise Office (LEO) grants aim to support female entrepreneurs, especially in early stages, providing direct funding and access to additional resources.
- 2. Female-Targeted Programs: Initiatives like Enterprise Ireland's "Going for Growth" and "ACORNS" offer mentorship, training, and development for female entrepreneurs in Ireland, helping women-led startups grow and scale.
- 3. Networking and Mentorship: Ireland emphasizes networking and mentoring opportunities, including pairing female entrepreneurs with seasoned business mentors, often through programs like Women in Business Network (WiB) and LEOs.
- **4. Policy Support for Work-Life Balance:** Female enterprise policies include family-friendly work environments, flexible working conditions, and childcare subsidies, making entrepreneurship more accessible for women with families.
- **5. Focus on STEM and High-Growth Sectors:** To increase diversity in high-growth areas, Ireland encourages female entrepreneurs in STEM through support for innovation, tech startups, and internationalization of female-led businesses.
- **6. Awareness and Research Efforts:** Governmental and independent research on female entrepreneurship helps identify gaps in support, track success metrics, and influence new policies to further close the gender gap in enterprise.











Local Enterprise Offices

Local Enterprise Offices (LEOs) in Ireland provide support to small businesses and startups, offering various services to foster local enterprise growth. Established in 2014 and overseen by Enterprise Ireland, these offices are located in each of the 31 local authority areas in Ireland, making them accessible throughout the country.

LEOs support businesses by offering:

- Financial Assistance: LEOs provide funding options like feasibility study grants, priming grants for startups, and expansion grants for growing businesses. They also assist businesses in accessing national funding schemes and loans.
- Training and Development: They offer training in areas like business planning, digital marketing, financial management, and sector-specific skills. This is aimed at enhancing entrepreneurial skills and knowledge.
- Mentoring and Advice: Entrepreneurs can access one-on-one mentoring, helping them navigate the
 business landscape, refine their strategies, and improve operations. LEOs also assist with regulatory advice
 and compliance.
- **Networking and Market Access:** LEOs facilitate networking events and connections to local and international markets, helping small businesses expand their reach and customer base.
- Female and Youth Entrepreneurship Programs: LEOs also support underrepresented groups, offering targeted programs like the "Women in Business" network and initiatives that promote
