	1. Understanding the barrier better: what is the current issue?
	2. Imagining the ideal situation where the barrier no longer exists: describe it, which are the features?
	3. Identifying the steps necessary to reach the ideal situation, going step by step backwards from the ideal situation to the current situation
	4. Elaborating what would needs to change, step by step
