

- Increase awareness
 of the benefits from working with nature
- Prioritise working with nature: enhancing ecosystems and their services and synergies with socio-economic objectives
- Enable working with nature: highlight available tools, policy instruments, experience
- Encourage learning by doing

- Dissemination of materials in all EU languages








Adopted on 1 June 2018:

- Public consultation: > 66 000 replies




Excerpt from the public consultation





