






Definition











@gapingvoid

Pilot actions are implementation-related activities dedicated to <u>testing</u> a new approach. This usually refers to the <u>transfer</u> of a good practice found in another region.

Context: growing experience



March 2018

First pilot action approved



81 pilot actions approved from 52 projects



June 2020

Set of measures

- Adapting pilot actions in phase 2 (1st and 2nd call projects)
- Pilot action in phase 1 (4th call projects)

April 2021 (tbc)

Programme expectations



Pilot actions need to fulfil 3 conditions

1. Relevance and durability

- ✓ To clearly contribute to the policy instrument tackled in the region.
- ✓ Part of the action plan of that region.
- ✓ The measures to ensure the durability have to be precisely defined.

2. Interregionality

✓ Pilot actions need to be clearly related to the interregional learning process.

3. Additionality


✓ The region proposing a pilot action should explain why this action cannot be financed by the relevant local, regional or national funds.

Process to request a pilot:



Pre-check with JS

- Important to optimise process (no need to complete full template for pilot actions with no potential).
- Can take place during the mid-term review meeting or by phone/email.
- Related to core criteria mentioned in programme manual:
 Relevance, Interregionality, Additionality
- A positive pre-check does not ensure that the pilot action is finally recommended.
- Max: One pilot per partner region
- Budget Between EUR 10,000 and EUR 80,000.





LP sends the pilot request template to JS

1.1 Relevance

Context of the pilot action

✓	Is the pilot action contributing to the achievement of the project's objectives?

✓	Is the action clearly defined and with an implementation character?					
✓	Is the testing character of the pilot action clear?					
Policy relevance and durability						
✓	Is it confirmed that the pilot action is a full part of the action plan for the region(s) concerned?					
✓	Is the pilot action clearly linked to the policy instrument addressed in the application form or to another policy instrument addressed in the action plan?					
✓	Does the pilot action clearly contribute to this policy instrument?					
✓	Is it explained how the pilot action will be mainstreamed (in case of success) and how its durability will					

Pilot action assessment



1.2 Additionality

Additionality

✓ Is it clearly explained why other local, national, regional funds cannot be allocated in order to support the implementation of the pilot action?

1.3 Interregionality

Link between the pilot action and the interregional learning activities

- ✓ Does the pilot action clearly derive from the exchange of experience process?
- ✓ In case the pilot action refers to the transfer of a good practice or lesson learnt from a different region, are the transferred elements clearly described?

1.4 Feasibility

Feasibility

- ✓ Are the planned activities feasible in terms of scope and timing?
- ✓ Is the budget adequate for the implementation of the pilot action proposed? (FO check)
- ✓ Is it confirmed that the pilot action is not state aid relevant? (FO check)
- ✓ If new organisations are involved in the implementation of the pilot actions, are they eligible to the Interreg Europe programme?

















Conclusion

Elements for a good pilot action

- It is related to the improvement of a policy instrument (relevance)
- It is linked to the exchange of experience process (interregionality)
- Testing is precisely defined (activities + beneficiaries)
- It is feasible (one year to implement)

It is useful for your territory....and will therefore be **mainstreamed** (Durability)


