Examples

The new Vienna training fund model for the hotel industry

• Inter-company training workshop

- Training cost paid jointly by The Vienna Employment Promotion Fund and the Public Employment Service in Vienna
- Apprentices' income paid by The Vienna Employment Promotion Fund

Germany

- SMEs receive a one-time premium of €2 000 for each newly concluded training contract and €3 000 for new additional training contracts
- SMEs that are unable to continue the training within their premises will be given a temporary subsidy to continue the training of their apprentices in a joint inter-company training center
- Companies that additionally take on apprentices who are unable to continue their training due to the insolvency of their training company will receive a take-over bonus.
