



STOB regions:

- Success-o-meter: a self-assessment tool for knowledge in business transfer
 - 16 unique questions that address the preparation and process of succession
 - Free for all
 - Over 20.000 tests performed
 - Scientific validity of the tool has been positively peer-reviewed
 - Enables to evaluate the needs for action

Ensuring the continuity of existing businesses through successful transfer or takeover is a challenge for many European regions and represents a significant potential in terms of maintaining employment and economic activities. The topic is often not strongly taken into consideration in policy or not strongly communicated.

It is therefore meaningful to promote the development of suitable policy approaches. The success-o-meter provides hereby a straight forward and easily transferable tool enabling to address a large target group, identify the most critical needs and eventually develop further policy measures to address them.

Horizontal challenges Access to skills, knowledge, networks – Practices



STOB regions:

- Next step: succession wiki (under preparation): comprehensive digital online reference guidebook gives an overview of four main topics:
 - 1. transfer of a company (handing over as a senior)
 - 2. internal succession (within a family of family network)
 - 3. external succession (buyers, employees)
 - 4. General Aspects concerning people who seek information (e.g. advisors, students, policy-makers)

This practice is much about role models and the huge social capital represented by entrepreneurs' experiences while setting-up and running a business. It provides an interesting complementary approach to entrepreneurship and business creation policies, which focus commonly on providing support in terms of expertise, training, facilities or funding. While all of this is important, the practice reminds us that setting up and running a business is primarily a human experience which cannot be fully rationalised. And this experience cannot be better translated than by entrepreneurs themselves.

iEER

Contamination Lab of Polytechnic University of Marche

- Addresses the lack of variety in entrepreneurial team composition when developing new ideas and when starting new companies.
- Four areas: the cHouse (for group work), the cClass (for seminars and other learning activities), the cWork (for hosting nascent entrepreneurs) and the cFun (for relax)
- 50 students coming from all the curricula (Medicine, Engineering, Economy, Natural Sciences, Rural Sciences) and all years of study
- Students from two other universities and from a high school
- Developing together entrepreneurial projects
- High demand high quality of projects (3 out of 8 continue after the programme)

This project resulted from a discussion between leading entrepreneurial universities in Italy, stimulated by the Italian Ministry of University and Research. Given the success experienced by those universities that acted as pioneer in the development of the programme, in 2016 the Italian Ministry of University and Research issued a call for the replication of this practice in other universities.

Horizontal challenges Access to infrastructures - Practices



ESSPO

- Bind 4.0
 - Public-private acceleration programme
 - Opportunity to access non-refundable funding, equity loans and/or favorable conditions financing from 30.000 euros up to a maximum of 500.000 euros, depending on the stage of the startup.
 - Connecting startups with leading Industry 4.0 manufacturing, energy, and healthcare companies and contracts worth up to €150,000.
 - High demand among international start-ups
 - 27 international start-ups already selected (40 business projects in cooperation with 27 big corporates)

 - Owner: Basque Government

From the beginning, the BIND 4.0 programme has been characterised by high demand from the international start-up scene. Already under the first call, more than 250 applications were submitted from companies located in 41 countries. Until now, 27 international start-ups have been selected to develop a total of 40 projects in collaboration with 27 big corporates.

ATM for SMEs

MICROCREDIT FUND FOR ENTERPRISE CREATION USING ESF FUNDS

- ESF Microcredit fund offering microloans in order to support individuals with difficulties in accessing traditional credit channels to start up a business
- Microloans of EUR 5,000-25,000
- Reimbursable at zero percent interest and without guarantees
- Sustained high demand since 2009
- Few defaults (about 3% fo microloans according to 2015 evaluation)
- The provision of non-financial services combined with a micro-loan improves the repayment capacity and overall performance of the microcredit fund

The practice illustrates well the possibility to use ESF Funding for microloans at favorable conditions to support individuals or start-ups with difficulty to access traditional credit channels. The experience gained by the Sardinia region in the management of the Microcredit ESF Fund can facilitate preparation of programmatic documents and ensure a model for access to information, support in the strategic review in the use of resources and certification of expenditure for other regions.

- MurciaBan Business Angels Network
 - Online platform to connect Business Angels with Entrepreneurs
 - Facilitate access to funding for projects with growth potential
 - Promote investments (co-investments)
 - Promote learning and continuous updatingof investors
 - Offer specific trainings for entrepreneurs
 - 73 active investors
 - 14 investment forums 80 projects

Although the consolidation of a BAN normally is not a fast procedure, it allows a lot of learning opportunities and a better entrepreneurial ecosystem knowledge.
