#### **Origins of BEEP/Background**



Durham recognised the need to reduce business carbon emissions to achieve carbon targets

#### **County Durham:**

- Approx 530,000 people
- Rural with a few large towns/small city
- Areas of off-gas houses/businesses
- History of industry/mines regenerated with business parks
- Large proportion of smaller SMEs

#### Challenge

Getting smaller businesses engaged with energy efficiency.



## **Business Energy Efficiency Project 2**

#### Followed on from BEEP

We improved the bid, learning from our first ERDF PA4b energy project:

- More targeting of support to areas of need
- Better communications and engagement
- Utilising existing tools and skills
- Budget: £1,730,017
- Timescales 2019-2022
- Key Objectives: engage with 324 SMEs, and save 2,633 tonnes of carbon
- Resources: 5 staff, website, social media



#### **Key features:**

#### Free consultation, audit and report

- Delivered by in-house professional energy officers (staff employed specifically for BEEP)
- Usually between 1 and 4 hours to deliver on site, plus analysis, research and report writing/feedback
- Each business has their own named energy officer
- Audit covers:
  - Premises (insulation, heating, lighting, renewables)
  - Production technology (e.g. compressors)
  - Transport and broader sustainability aspects
- Grant support for improvements- scaled between 20% and 40% up to project value of £24,999
- Simple application process. Staff already know about the SME and improvements/savings
- Fact sheets and online resources to support and build capacity in SME energy management



# Measures implemented into BEEP 2 to help engage with smaller SMEs

- Part time Engagement Officer
- One quotation for work
- 20% standard for LED upgrades
- Flexible with grants depending on technology
- Closer relationship with businesses
- Grants changed back from GBER to de minimus to avoid having to refuse 'Undertakings in Difficulty'



## **Key Features that makes BEEP 2 successful**

- Easy for SME's to engage with
- No upfront costs to SMEs for audits
- On-going support and long term engagement
- Independent audit
- Trusted delivery body (local authority)
- Grants scaled to match priorities and paybacks



#### **Challenges**

- Risk of delivery/clawback sits with Durham
- Likely to be more expensive per tonne of carbon
- Covid- model works best with engagement, but the team have overcome this and continued to deliver



#### **Advantages**

- Reaches SMEs who would not normally have resources to apply for ERDF
- Improves reputation of local authority
- Develops in-house skilled team of auditors improved recommendations over time
- Improves business performance and the carbon footprint of County Durham and the SME
