Why do we host a webinar on social enterprises?

EU context



- The social economy & entrepreneurship accounts for:
 - 2.8 million social economy enterprises and organisations
 - 13.6 million jobs
 - 8% EU GDP

According to the European Economic and Social Committee' study "Recent evolutions of the Social Economy in the EU" (2016)

EU policy context



- Social Economy Europe (SEE) was created in November 2000
- EC launched the Social Business Initiative in 2011
- EU Programme for Employment and Social Innovation (EaSI) (2014-2020)
- EU Parliament Social Economy Intergroup (1990/2015)
- Work is underway for an European Action Plan for Social Economy
 - A task of Nicolas Schmit, the new Commissioner for Jobs and Social Rights.

The challenge




- According to an EC mapping study:
 - Specialist business development services for SEs are lacking and fragmented
 - Limited number of social enterprise incubators, mentoring schemes, specialist infrastructure and investment readiness services across the EU
- SEs in different stages of their development have different support needs for which support might not be available
