## Why are we tackling the topic?



- We think it is relevant to our community and other policy makers.
- It is the foundation for all other SME support programmes.
- In 2018 only 6.5% of working youth (20-29 years old) in the EU were self-employed and even fewer were employers.
- According to the <u>OECD</u>, "Public policy can address many of the market and institutional failures in youth entrepreneurship by increasing awareness about the potential of entrepreneurship, embedding entrepreneurship teaching at all levels of education, offering training and coaching outside of education, improving access to finance and supporting the development of entrepreneurship networks for young people."

## What will you learn?



- We will showcase various entrepreneurial programmes across Europe.
- We want you to reflect on the programmes and initiatives run in your region and see whether you are missing some entrepreneurship services at various education stages.
  - We will start the journey in East-Flanders, Belgium where a holistic set of innovative programmes are aimed at primary and secondary school students.
